- 2. Provide a letter of recommendation (from a medical school faculty member in any medical specialty).

- Applicant is a medical student entering 4th year in July, 2023, in good standing.
- Applicant has applied and has been offered UC Davis Dermatology rotation through VSLO program.

- Applicant self-identifies as a member of an underrepresented in medicine group.
