Information regarding deadlines, availability, and requirements of each resource is subject to change. It is the student's responsibility to be aware of all deadlines and requirements. The financial aid office is not responsible for students missing application deadlines.

When requesting applications, it is usually helpful to provide as much pertinent information about yourself as possible (e.g., grade level, academic year for which funds are being requested) and how you meet the award criteria (such as heritage, year in school, organization affiliation, etc.).

If you receive an award from an organization, be sure to **write a thank-you letter** to the donor and/or the organization. This simple, but crucial step, if forgotten, may result in donors who choose to stop funding programs for students. Most people like to have their acts of generosity acknowledged.

IDENTIFYING ADDITIONAL SOURCES OF AID - Other potential sources of funds include local hospitals, hospital guilds and community organizations in your hometown. The high school and/or college(s) you attended may also sponsor scholarships. Many companies and organizations sponsor programs for the children and/or grandchildren of their employees or members. You or your parents/grandparents should inquire directly with the organization about the availability of educational assistance funds.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH (NIH) LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAMS (LRP) (2014)

New LRP contracts are awarded for a two-year period and repay up to \$35,000 of qualified educational debt annually. Tax offsets also are provided as additional benefits.
