

## INFECTION CONTROL AND RISK ASSESSMENT CONSULTING SERVICES

## PROJECT 9556510, REPLACEMENT HOSPITAL TOWER (CALIFORNIA TOWER)

UC Davis Health in Sacramento, California requests Statements of Qualifications on or before <u>2 p.m.</u> <u>Thursday</u>, <u>November 16</u>, <u>2023</u>, from qualified firms interested in providing the Replacement Hospital Tower (California Tower) project with Infection Control and Risk Assessment services during construction for both the remainder of the ongoing make-ready work and new hospital tower.

The selected firm(s) will provide construction dust control and infection control and risk assessment (ICRA) services, overseen by an ABIH Certified Industrial Hygienist. Services are expected to meet or exceed applicable regulations, including, but not limited to those enforced by Cal/OSHA, Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) and California Department of Public Health (CDPH). The ICRA professional shall perform all services provided in accordance with the Contract Documents, Design, and Construction of Buildings Under HCAI jurisdiction, as well as all applicable State and local codes and regulations. All interested firms need to demonstrate their experience and development of best practices providing such services at hospitals, clinics, pharmacies, and other healthcare facilities.

The University intends to select to select one (1) Infection Control and Risk Assessment consulting firm. The expected duration of the Agreement for these services will be three (3) years from the time of contract award.

Statements of qualifications must be submitted electronically no later than **2 p.m.**, **Thursday**, **November 16**, **2023**, to the link to be provided by UC Davis Health. No hard copies will be accepted. Firms interested in responding to this RFQ must notify the University by Wednesday, November 15, 2023, to be provided a link to upload their Qualifications package. Statements of Qualifications will not be accepted after the date and time stipulated above.

Statements of qualifications shall be specifically tailored to this RFQ, responding directly to the screening criteria (See RFQ document and Consultant Qualification form available on the web page linked above). After

Qualification Statements are received, a Screening Committee will review, conduct reference checks, and recommend a short list of firms for interviews. A Selection Committee will conduct the interviews prior to selecting the successful firms.

Every effort will be made to ensure that all persons have equal access to contracts and other business opportunities with the University within the limits imposed by law or University policy. Each firm may be required to show evidence of its equal employment opportunity policy. The successful firm and their subconsultants will be required to follow the nondiscrimination requirements set forth in the Agreement documents and to pay prevailing wages at the location of the work. The work described in the Agreement is a public work subject to section 1771 of the California Labor Code.

Consultant/Design Professional shall pay all persons providing services and/or any labor on site, including any University location, no less than UC Fair Wage (defined as \$15 per hour as of 10/01/2017) and shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local working condition requirements.
