THE BETTY IRENE MOORE SCHOOL OF NURSING is

expanding rapidly over the next decade. During the early years of operation, facility requirements for the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing are met through existing resources on the Sacramento campus. Future growth in programs and enrollment will require new educational, administrative, faculty office and research space, as well as clinical training locations.

The School of Nursing is creating a new kind of learning environment where nursing, medical, health informatics and public health students at every level work together in collaborative teams to creatively solve society's most pressing health-care problems. This interprofessional, interdisciplinary, team-based approach to education and research will effectively transform how health care is delivered across a continuum of settings.

UNIQUE RESEARCH-FOCUSED SPACES

The graduate studies center was designed with environmentally sustainable spaces that bring faculty, researchers and students together in interdisciplinary and interprofessional teams. Technology will enable easy interaction with other researchers on the Davis campus and beyond.

Students from the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing and other UC Davis graduate degree programs will greatly benefit from the increased space provided by the new building.

ACADEMIC ENVIRONMENT

The existing Education Building and new graduate studies center will join a possible third integrated health education building in the future to enclose a landscaped quad on the Sacramento campus where education, research and clinical facilities intersect. The quad will lend an academic feeling to the campus, making it a more inviting atmosphere for students.
