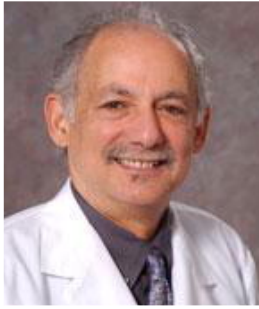


## Jay V. Solnick, M.D., Ph.D.

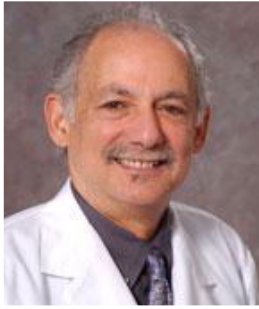
