

Peter Yellowlees, M.B.B.S., M.D.

Clinical Interests After completing his medical training in London, Dr. Yellowlees worked in Australia for twenty years where he completed his Board Certification in Psychiatry and a research Doctorate before becoming Chair of the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Queensland, and Founding Director of the Center for Online Health. He moved to UC Davis in 2004 to continue his research in telemedicine and eHealth and has an international reputation in telemedicine and long distance health and education delivery. He is an experienced speaker who has given over 150 presentations in 20 countries in the past five years. He has a number of research interests and is presently working on projects involving Internet e-mail and video consultation services and the use of virtual reality for health education on the Internet. He is currently Director of the Graduate Program in Health Informatics and Professor of Psychiatry at UC Davis.

Dr. Yellowlees has worked in public and private sectors, in academia, and in rural settings. He has published four books and about 150 scientific articles and book chapters and has been regularly involved in media presentations. His latest book, "Your Health in the Information Age" (www.InformationAgeHealth.com) was published in 2008. He has consulted to governments and private sector companies in several countries and has received about \$7 million in research grants. His main interests are in improving access to health and education services using information technologies.
