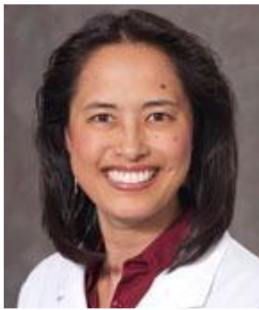


Kimdary Chek, M.D., M.P.H.
