Clinical Interests Dr. Garcia has been engaged in Latino health research since the early 1990s with a special interest in health disparities, chronic disease, behavioral health, immigrant health, injury and violence prevention in the Latino community.

Dr. Garcia is a Resource Center for Minority Aging Research (RCMAR) Scholar for the UC Davis Center to Advance Cognitive Health and Healthcare in Older Latinos and the Principal Investigator of a pilot project titled “The Impact of Neighborhood Context on Older Latino’s Chronic Health Status” which hypothesizes that low neighborhood socioeconomic position (SEP) will negatively impact older Latino’s chronic health.

Dr. Garcia was formerly an Interdisciplinary Women’s Health Research (IWHR) Scholar from the NIH-sponsored BIRCWH (Building Interdisciplinary Research Careers in Women's Health) program at the UC Davis School of Medicine. Her research focused on health disparities in Mexican, White and African American women; specifically metabolic and nutritional syndromes, particularly obesity, pre-diabetes, diabetes and health-related complications, such as heart disease, stroke, and high blood pressure.
