Hi everyone,

I am reaching out to request your help. Ideally, we want to align academic preparation with the population of patients our APP staff care for. Sometimes there are split roles where a provider is expected to practice in ambulatory and acute care and choosing the right provider becomes more complex. In situations like this, we want to promote safety both for our patients and the provider. We have had a few safety situations with APPs that were trained in family medicines but were practicing in acute care.

To support safe care, we have decided on using an FPPE process. This is the joint commission recommended path to incorporate new skills for credentialed providers. You have been identified as a potential lecturer for the health system FPPE process.

- FPPE will be used for providers who are practicing in the acute setting but do not have educational preparation for the population or setting of acute care
- They will not practice independently in an intensive care unit but may observe
- There will be a recorded lecture series with a post test for each lecture
 - Proposed curriculum:
 - Hospital culture and rounding: Jamie Myers, AGACNP- confirmed
 - Acute Mental Status changes: Lara Zimmerman- confirmed
 - Acute cardiovascular complaints: ?
 - Basic or Advanced 12 lead ECG interpretation- CPPN
 - Acute respiratory complaints: Danise Seaters
 - Chest Xray interpretation (incorporate)
 - Evaluating the Acute abdomen: Leshikar- complete
 - Managing acute behavioral health issues: Jessica Vetter
 - Antimicrobial stewardship: Sandrock- compete
 - Managing in patient diabetes: Charity Tan
 - Managing the geriatric patient: Anna Satake
 - Hospital follow up care and discharge management: ?
- They will need to complete 500 hours of clinical practice in acute care (approx. 3 months of practice)
- They will be allowed two attempts to pass the exam portion for each module. If they fail after the second try they will be assigned required reading and remediation.
- Ideally, this will be housed in the CPPN and assigned on hire to those that have less than 3 years' experience in acute care and no acute care board certification
- The same process will be used for pediatric FPPE for providers who care for children but are not certified in their population foci
- Goal date for completion of the FPPE series is January 2021.

I know the goal date is short. I am hoping that you will agree to participate. Lectures should be 40-50 minutes in duration with a post test that is 5 questions. Lectures will be recorded on web-ex at a time that is convenient for you. I can send you an invitation or you can schedule and record your own web-ex and send me the final product. The lectures will be used as an enduring resource and may be updated every two years if content has changed.

Perioperative Glycemic Control Clinical Decision Support Preop Assessment

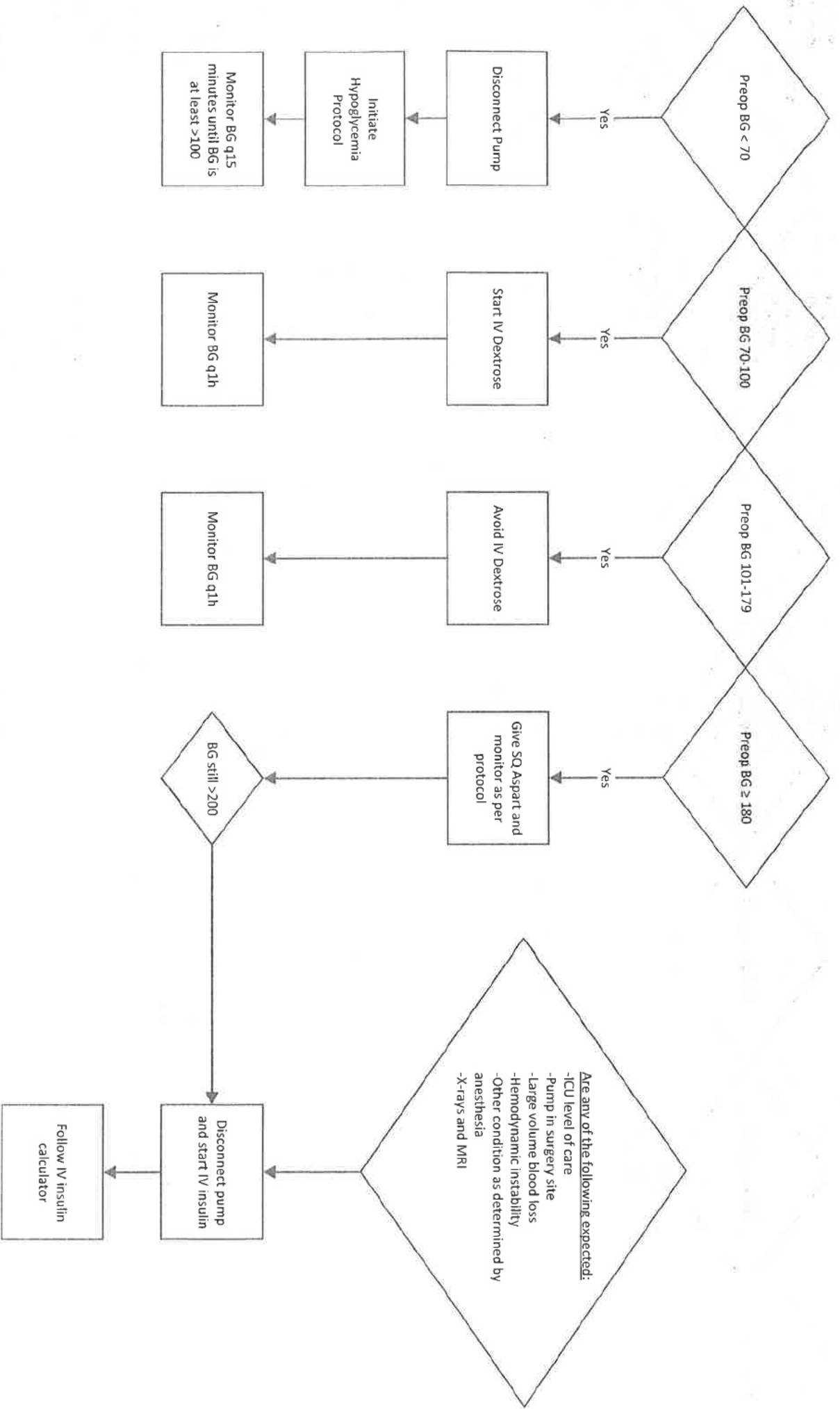
