



Master of Public Health

Curriculum

The Master of Public Health program consists of 56 quarter units. 40 units are for core course requirements and the remaining 16 units are for electives. During the program, students will select a concentration in epidemiology or general public health to fulfill their degree requirements. The typical length of the program is 10-12 months.

Public Health Practicum

The curriculum includes a practicum that allows students to gain practical experience working on a 300-hour project related to their area of interest and/or career goals in public health. The practicum is a unique opportunity for students to synthesize and integrate knowledge acquired through coursework and other learning experiences and to apply theory and principle in a practical public health setting.
